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

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Country Lane Student Boundary



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No School Traffic Relief!

- Most students live north or east of schools
- Vast majority of vehicles (buses and cars) carrying students to/from schools must still use 51st St/Omaha
- Only way to fix that problem is to widen these apartments Omaha, or build additional schools, not build

- BAPS has had connections to neighborhood streets before, and they don't work

- More traffic on Kansas St and First St will endanger children, parents, and property

Elm Place Hill is Dangerous

- Drivers routinely "race" down the hill
- Fatal accident on top of hill
- Crown Village fence damaged by out of control car that left roadway last year
- Motorcyclist slid off Elm at bottom of curve
- Cars already turning across this high speed traffic, to/from Crown Village

Elm Hill is Dangerous

- Adding more entrances/exits is not a good
- Sending school traffic out them, even worse idea





- Buffer between Crown Village and schools
- No need to connect street to school or through Country Lane Estates
- Use sidewalks / separated bike paths instead

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
