AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL CONSULTANT SERVICES BETWEEN CITY OF BROKEN ARROW AND PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANTS, P.A. FOR

NORTH ASPEN AVENUE REHABILITATION PROJECT ST24190

This AGREEMENT, including Attachment A through Attachment E, between the City of Broken Arrow (OWNER) and Professional Engineering Consultants, P.A., (CONSULTANT);

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, OWNER intends to repair various residential streets within the City of Broken Arrow (PROJECT) for which, OWNER has requested that CONSULTANT provide certain professional services as required and,

WHEREAS, CONSULTANT is qualified and capable to provide the professional services required;

NOW, therefore, in consideration of the promises contained in this AGREEMENT, OWNER and CONSULTANT agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - EFFECTIVE DATE

This AGREEMENT shall be effective upon signature of both parties.

ARTICLE 2 - GOVERNING LAW

This AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oklahoma and venue for any action concerning this Agreement shall be in the District Court of Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

ARTICLE 3 - SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY CONSULTANT

CONSULTANT shall perform the SERVICES described in Attachment A, Scope of Services. If construction phase services are included, the CONSULTANT shall be the OWNER'S representative to observe, record and report with respect to all services that are required or authorized by the construction documents.

ARTICLE 4 – ORGANIZATION OF SUBMITAL DOCUMENTS

CONSULTANT shall prepare the documents as described in Attachment B as part of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 5 - COMPENSATION

OWNER shall pay CONSULTANT in accordance with Attachment C, Compensation and Additional Services.

ARTICLE 6 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

OWNER shall be responsible for all matters described in Attachment D, OWNER'S Responsibilities and Special Conditions.

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ARTICLE 7 - STANDARD OF CARE

CONSULTANT shall perform the SERVICES undertaken in a manner consistent with the prevailing accepted standard for similar services with respect to projects of comparable function and complexity, and with the applicable state laws, as well as the specific codes, regulations, design criteria and construction specifications adopted by the OWNER and other governing policies published and generally considered authoritative by CONSULTANT'S profession that are in effect at the time of performance of these SERVICES. CONSULTANT is obligated to perform professional services in accordance with the foregoing standard with respect to the laws, codes, regulations, design criteria and construction specifications that are applicable pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE 8 - LIABILITY

- 8.1 <u>General.</u> Having considered the potential liabilities that may exist during the performance of these SERVICES, the benefits of the PROJECT, and CONSULTANT'S fee for the SERVICES; and in consideration of the promises contained in this AGREEMENT, OWNER and CONSULTANT agree to allocate and limit such liabilities in accordance with Article 10.
- 8.2 <u>Indemnification.</u> CONSULTANT agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless OWNER, and its agents and employees, from and against legal liability for all claims, losses, damages, and expenses to the extent such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are caused by the negligent or intentional wrongful acts, errors, or omissions of CONSULTANT, its agents or employees. In the event claims, losses, damages, or expenses are caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of OWNER and CONSULTANT, or their agents or employees, then they, along with OWNER's cost of defense, shall be borne by each party in proportion to each entity's own negligence.
- 8.3 <u>Consequential Damages.</u> OWNER shall not be liable to CONSULTANT for any special, indirect, or consequential damages resulting in any way from the performance of the SERVICES such as, but not limited to, loss of use, loss of revenue, or loss of anticipated profits.
- 8.4 <u>Survival.</u> Upon completion of all SERVICES, obligations, and duties provided for in this AGREEMENT, or if this AGREEMENT is terminated for any reason, the terms and conditions of this Article 8 shall survive.

ARTICLE 9 - INSURANCE

During the performance of the SERVICES under this AGREEMENT, CONSULTANT shall maintain the following insurance:

- (1) General Liability Insurance, with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$1,000,000 in the aggregate;
- (2) Automobile Liability Insurance, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 for each person, not less than \$1,000,000 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000 for property damage; and
- (3) Professional Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 annual aggregate.

CONSULTANT shall furnish OWNER certificates of insurance, which shall include a provision that such insurance shall not be canceled without at least thirty (30) days written notice to OWNER. All PROJECT sub-consultants shall be required to name OWNER as an Additional Insured and certificate holder on their certificates of insurance for the PROJECT, and shall be required to indemnify OWNER and CONSULTANT to the same extent. CONSULTANT shall be held responsible to submit certificates of insurance for sub-consultants to OWNER prior to the sub-consultant's release to commence work.

ARTICLE 10 - LIMITATIONS OF RESPONSIBILITY

CONSULTANT shall not be responsible for: (1) construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures, or safety precautions and programs in connection with the construction of the PROJECT; or (2) procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such responsibilities are specifically assigned to CONSULTANT in Attachment A, Scope of Services.

ARTICLE 11 - LIMITATIONS OF RESPONSIBILITIES FOR ACTS OF OTHERS

CONSULTANT shall not at any time supervise, direct, control or have authority over any work performed by any employee, contractor or other agent of OWNER. CONSULTANT shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of any employee, contractor or other agent associated with the PROJECT except for its own employees, subcontractors and other agents.

ARTICLE 12 - OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE

Since CONSULTANT has no control over the cost of labor, materials, or equipment furnished by others, or over the resources provided by others to meet PROJECT schedules, CONSULTANT'S opinion of probable costs and of PROJECT schedules shall be made on the basis of experience and qualifications as a professional. CONSULTANT does not guarantee that proposals, bids, or actual PROJECT costs will conform to OWNER'S cost estimates or that actual schedules will conform to OWNER'S projected schedules.

ARTICLE 13 - REUSE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including, but not limited to, drawings, specifications, and details, reports, etc. prepared by CONSULTANT pursuant to this AGREEMENT are instruments of service in respect to the PROJECT. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by OWNER or others on extensions of the PROJECT or on any other project. Any reuse or adaptation without prior written verification by the CONSULTANT for the specific purpose intended will be at OWNER'S sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to the CONSULTANT. OWNER shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the CONSULTANT against all claims, losses, damages, injuries, and expenses, including attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from such reuse to the extent allowed by law.

ARTICLE 14 - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Except as otherwise provided herein, engineering documents, drawings, and specifications prepared by CONSULTANT as part of the SERVICES shall become the property of OWNER. CONSULTANT shall retain its rights in its standard drawing details, specifications, data bases, computer software, and other proprietary property. Rights to intellectual property developed, utilized, or modified in the performance of the SERVICES shall remain the property of CONSULTANT, but shall be provided to the OWNER, at no additional expense to the OWNER.

ARTICLE 15 - TERMINATION

This AGREEMENT may be terminated by either party upon written notice in the event of substantial failure by the either party to perform in accordance with the terms of this AGREEMENT. The non-performing party shall have fifteen (15) calendar days from the date of the termination notice to cure or to submit a plan for cure acceptable to the other party.

OWNER may suspend performance of this AGREEMENT for OWNER'S convenience upon written notice to CONSULTANT. Upon restart, an equitable adjustment may be made to CONSULTANT'S compensation, if the period of suspension has created an economic hardship for the CONSULTANT.

ARTICLE 16 - DELAY IN PERFORMANCE

Neither OWNER nor CONSULTANT shall be considered in default of this AGREEMENT for delays in performance caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the non-performing party. For purposes of this AGREEMENT, such circumstances include, but are not

limited to, abnormal weather conditions such as floods, earthquakes, fire; civil disturbances such as war, riots, or other civil epidemic; power outages, strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns, or other labor disturbances; sabotage; judicial restraint, and inability to procure permits, licenses, or authorizations from any local, state, or federal agency for any of the supplies, materials, accesses, or services required to be provided by either OWNER or CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT.

Should such circumstances occur, the non-performing party shall, within a reasonable time of being prevented from performing, give written notice to the other party describing the circumstances preventing continued performance and the efforts being made to resume performance of this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE 17 - WAIVER

A waiver by either OWNER or CONSULTANT of any breach of this AGREEMENT shall be in writing. Such a waiver shall not affect the waiving party's rights with respect to any other or further breach.

ARTICLE 18 - SEVERABILITY

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this AGREEMENT or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this AGREEMENT void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this AGREEMENT. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this AGREEMENT, and the balance of this AGREEMENT shall be construed and enforced as if this AGREEMENT did not contain the particular portion or provision held to be void. The parties further agree to amend this AGREEMENT to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this Article shall not prevent this entire AGREEMENT from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this AGREEMENT be determined void.

ARTICLE 19 - INTEGRATION

This AGREEMENT represents the entire and integrated AGREEMENT between OWNER and CONSULTANT. It supersedes all prior and contemporaneous communications, representations, and agreements, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE 20 - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

To the extent permitted by Article 22, OWNER and CONSULTANT each binds itself and its successors and assigns to the other party to this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE 21 - ASSIGNMENT

Neither OWNER nor CONSULTANT shall assign its duties under this AGREEMENT without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless otherwise stated in the written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any obligation under this AGREEMENT. Nothing contained in this Article shall prevent CONSULTANT from employing independent sub-consultants, associates, and sub-contractors to assist in the performance of the SERVICES. However, third party entities must comply with Article 9.

ARTICLE 22 - THIRD PARTY RIGHTS

Nothing in this AGREEMENT shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than OWNER and CONSULTANT.

ARTICLE 23 - COMPLETION

CONSULTANT shall complete the services within the time frame outlined on Attachment E, Schedule, subject to conditions which are beyond the control of the CONSULTANT.

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ARTICLE 24 - IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE

- 24.1 CONSULTANT shall demonstrate that he:
- 24.1.1 Has complied, and shall at all times during the term of this Contract, comply in all respects with all immigration-related laws, statutes, ordinances and regulations including without limitation, the Immigration and Nationality Act, as amended, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended, and the Oklahoma Taxpayer and Citizen Protection Act of 2007 (Oklahoma HB 1804) and any successor laws, ordinances or regulations (collectively, the Immigration Laws"); and
- 24.1.2 Has properly maintained, and shall at all times during the term of this Contract, maintain any and all employee records required by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security ("DHS"), including, without limitation, properly completed and maintained Form I-9s for each of the Consultants employees; and
- 24.1.3 Has verified the employment eligibility for all employees hired on or after July 1, 2008 through DHS's E-Verify system, and shall at all times continue to verify the employment eligibility of all employees hired during the term of this Contract; and
- 24.1.4 Has required, and will at all times during the term of this Contract, require any sub-contractor utilized, hired or sub-contracted for by Consultant for the completion or undertaking of any duties, tasks or responsibilities under this Contract, to comply with the requirements and obligations imposed by the Immigration Laws and set forth in Paragraphs 24.1.1, 24.1.2, and 24.1.3, above, with regards to each of the sub-contractor's employees.
- 24.2 CONSULTANT will indemnify, defend and hold harmless OWNER against any loss, cost, liability, expense (including, without limitation, costs and expenses of litigation and reasonable attorney's fees) demands, claims, actions, causes of action, liabilities, suits, damages, including special and consequential damages that arise from or in connection with, directly or indirectly, CONSULTANT'S failure, deliberate or negligent, to fulfill its obligations and representations regarding verifying the employment eligibility of its employees and the employees of any subcontractor utilized by CONSULTANT as set forth more fully in Paragraph 24.1 above.

ARTICLE 25 - COMMUNICATIONS

Any communication required by this AGREEMENT shall be made in writing to the address specified below:

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The following scope of services shall be made a part of the AGREEMENT dated the _____ day of 2025.

1.0 PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

1.1 CONSULTANT understands that the OWNER has retained their professional services in order to prepare Construction Documents for roadway resurfacing of North Aspen Avenue (S. 145th E. Ave) from West Kenosha Street to the southern edge of the eastbound Broken Arrow Expressway Ramps, and West Albany Street (E. 61st St.) from approximately 2,600 feet west of N. Aspen Ave. (near 136th E. Ave) to approximately 1,010 feet east of N. Aspen Ave. (at the concrete paving just east of SW Expressway Road), including limited curb and gutter replacement in Broken Arrow, OK, at the specified locations within this agreement. Work shall consist of the following: preparation of AutoCAD Base map/drawing from aerial imagery and linework; identification of all elements (i.e. asphaltic concrete milling and resurfacing, patching, curb, curb and gutter, and adjusting manholes and valve boxes to grade) requiring replacement and/or rehabilitation; and preparation of construction documents. These documents shall consist of, but not be limited to, the following: title sheet: paying repair/resurfacing plan sheets: pay item and general notes; standard details and standard drawings associated with the project specifics (provided by the OWNER); stormwater management plan; striping detail sheets; construction phasing and traffic control sheets; and special construction specifications, if needed; meeting all requirements for an Oklahoma Department of Transportation bid project.

2.0 PROJECT SCOPE

- 2.1 The project consists of asphaltic concrete milling and resurfacing, curb, curb and gutter, and adjusting manholes and valve boxes to grade along North Aspen Avenue (S. 145th E. Ave) from West Kenosha Street to the southern edge of the eastbound Broken Arrow Expressway Ramps, and West Albany Street (E. 61st St.) from approximately 2,600 feet west of N. Aspen Ave. near 136th E. Ave to approximately 1,010 feet east of N. Aspen Ave. at the concrete paving just east of SW Expressway Road (Project No. ST24190) in accordance with all current Oklahoma Department of Transportation and City of Broken Arrow specifications, and MUTCD requirements.
 - 2.1.1 The CONSULTANT shall provide a base map drawing, in AutoCAD (version 2024 or newer), on which to show the work that will be necessary, consisting of the following:

- 2.1.1.1 Prepare an AutoCAD base map/drawing from aerial imagery for use in plan preparation.
- 2.1.1.2 Generate and display edge of pavement lines, back-of-curb and face-of-curb lines, water valves, manholes, sidewalk and ramps right-of-way and lot lines, driveway linework (where applicable), miscellaneous improvements, existing utilities based on above ground information and existing atlas information, and street addresses from aerial imagery.
- 2.1.2 The CONSULTANT shall provide construction documents, consisting of the following:
 - 2.1.2.1 Identification and quantification of all elements (asphalt pavement, milling, and overlay, curb, curb and gutter, driveways, sidewalk, curb ramps, inlets, and adjusting manholes and valve boxes to grade) requiring replacement and/or rehabilitation. Sidewalk replacement shall be determined by visual inspection for obvious ADA non-compliance issues (i.e. tripping hazards) however issues not readily apparent to visual inspection will be excluded (i.e. slopes will not be measured for compliance.) Curb ramps shall be added in locations where sidewalk exists.
 - 2.1.2.2 Preparation of construction plans and development of an engineer's estimate of construction cost for and other documentation necessary to meet all submittal requirements for an Oklahoma Department of Transportation Bid/Let Project.

3.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

- 3.1 **ADMINISTRATIVE/MANAGERIAL DUTIES**: CONSULTANT shall be responsible to perform the following tasks throughout the course of the PROJECT:
 - 3.1.1 Document meetings, conferences, coordination, phone conversations, etc. and send documentation to OWNER within three (3) calendar days, as requested.
 - 3.1.2 Meet with the OWNER and ODOT staff in a scoping meeting in order to determine design criteria, requirements and codes and other critical design features of the Project such as project schedule and milestone dates.
 - 3.1.3 Provide OWNER with a list of all proposed sub-consultants and tasks sub-consultants are responsible to perform.
 - 3.1.4 Meet with the OWNER and ODOT at plan submittal milestones to discuss review comments for the project and incorporate appropriate comments into the following phase. It is anticipated that there will be a Preliminary Design Plan-in-Hand review meeting and a Final Field Review meeting. Project submittal milestones and meetings to meet the requirements for an ODOT Bid/Let project.

- 3.2.4.1 Prepare Final Submittal Package, including all PS&E Documentation required for an Oklahoma Department of Transportation Let/Bid project.
- 3.2.4.2 Upload Final Plan sheets, PS&E Documentation, and Engineer's Estimate through ProjectWise for final approval and letting by ODOT.
- 3.2.4.3 For all plan sets, submit to OWNER one (1) signed/sealed unbound set of half-size (11" x 17") drawings on bond paper, a PDF copy of the plans, and one (1) set of final drawings on electronic media (AutoCAD 2024 or newer), one (1) set of special construction specifications, if needed, in PDF format, and the final Engineer's Estimate of construction cost in PDF format.
- 3.3 **COORDINATION WITH ODOT ENVIRONMENTAL:** CONSULTANT shall be responsible to perform the following tasks throughout the course of the PROJECT to assist with the Environmental and Cultural Review:
