Facts about Conceptual Budget with 60' ROW and WATERLINE REPLACEMENT

- 1) Replace 15% of entire pavement section,
- 2) Cut 2' from each side of roadway and reconstruct edges with concrete under 2 inches of asphalt,
- 3) 2-inch Mill & overlay the balance of the 1150-foot-long project with new pavement on the WEST end to past N. 12th,
- 4) Typical pavement section is 24' wide asphalt with 2' of grass shoulders on each side for a 26' wide driving (clear zone) and recover surface,
- 5) Re-establish ditches with Solid Slab sod,
- 6) Add 5 foot concrete sidewalk on NORTHSIDE,
- 7) Replace 7 driveways with HES concrete to ROW and install new culvert pipes and end sections,
- 8) Improve College Ave asphalt pavement section
- 9) Add 2' wide grass bottom pilot ditch (Design No. 1) per R-64 ODOT Std with no concrete bottom ditch,
- 10) No Water Line or Meter Replacements

WHEREAS, CDBG Regulations 24 CFR 570.307(a) allow counties having a total combined population of 200,000 or more from the unincorporated areas and participating incorporated areas to qualify as an urban county; and,

WHEREAS, Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Public Law 93-383, as amended, authorized the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, as a representative of the United States of America, to grant to Tulsa County funds and administrative responsibility for the Tulsa County CDBG Urban County program; and

WHEREAS, a Cooperation Agreement between Tulsa County and the City has been executed for the purpose of participation in the Tulsa County Urban County Community Development Block Grant Program for Federal Fiscal Years 2023-2025; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Broken Arrow City Council that the City of Broken Arrow desires to obtain assistance in addressing community development needs and hereby requests the Tulsa County CDBG Urban County program to provide assistance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Broken Arrow City Council that the City of Broken Arrow affirms its commitment to take all action within its power to facilitate the receipt of the assistance of community development funds, and upon receipt to administer said grant by the rules and regulations established by the United States of America, the State of Oklahoma, Tulsa County and all empowered agencies thereof.

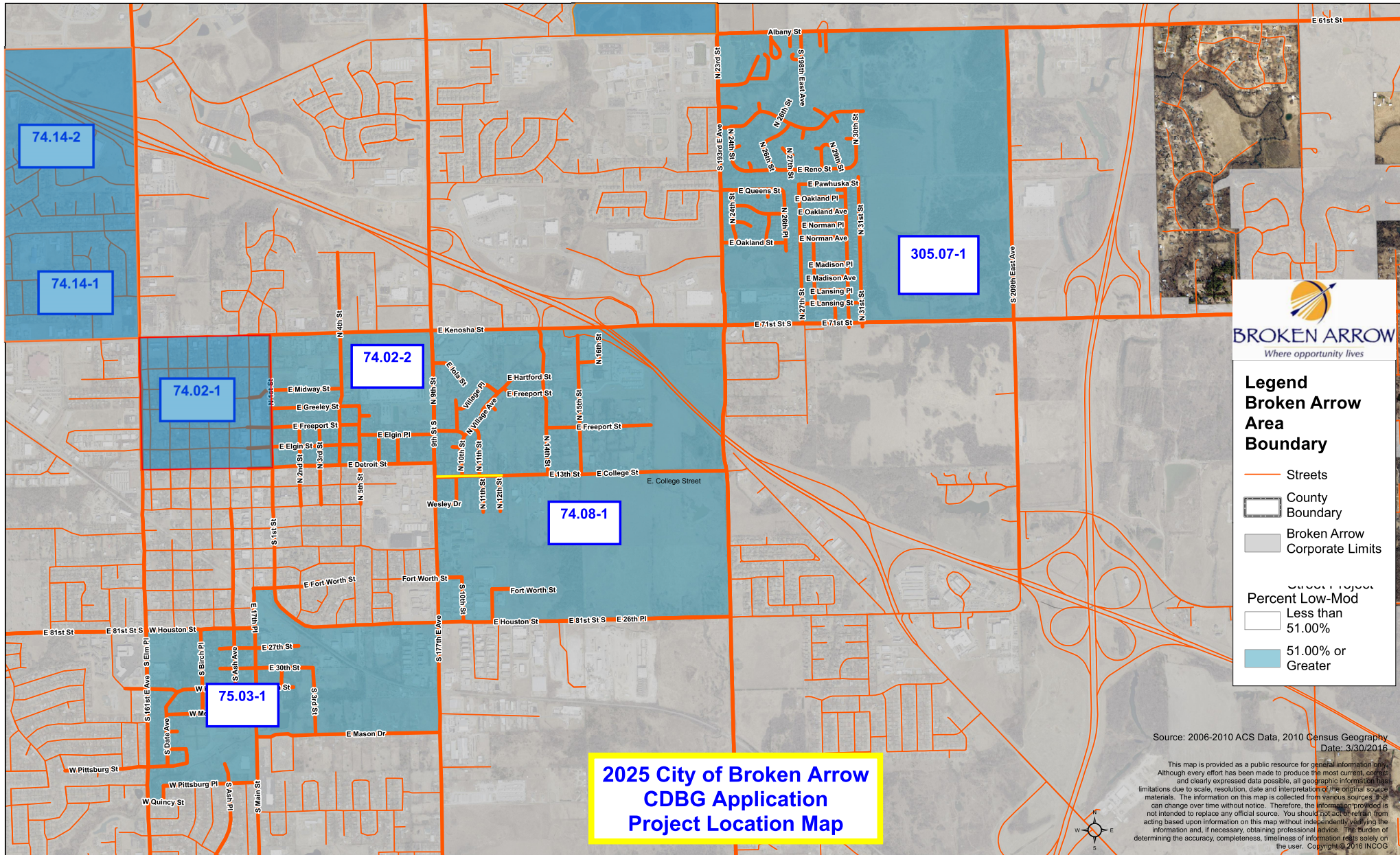

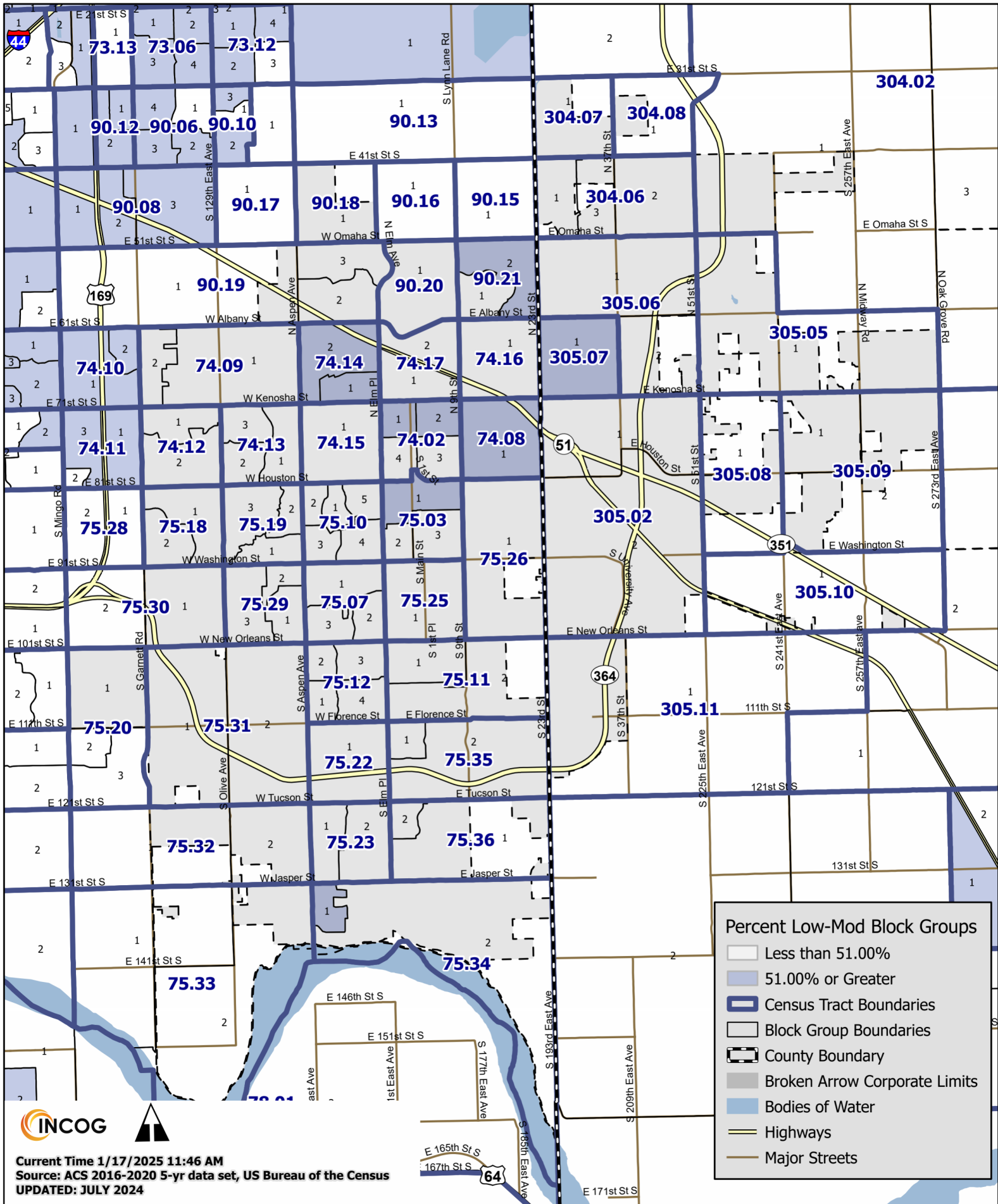

A Public Hearing will be held at 5:00 p.m., Monday, March 31, 2025 at the Broken Arrow Community Center, 1500 S. Main Street, Broken Arrow, Oklahoma to receive recommendations on housing needs for the cities and counties within the Metropolitan Tulsa HOME Consortium and non-housing community development needs for the cities within the Tulsa County CDBG Urban County. Tulsa County anticipates receiving approximately \$1,049,423 in FY 2025 HOME funds and \$1,492,079 in FY 2025 CDBG funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Citizens are requested to participate in the Hearing and express their views on the allocation of these funds. Citizens are requested to express their views on housing needs in Bartlesville, Broken Arrow, Bixby, Bristow, Catoosa, Claremore, Collinsville, Coweta, Drumright, Glenpool, Hominy, Jenks, Owasso, Pawhuska, Sand Springs, Sapulpa, Skiatook, Sperry and the unincorporated areas of Creek, Osage, Rogers, Tulsa, Wagoner and Washington Counties. Citizens are also requested to express their views on non-housing community development needs in Broken Arrow, Bixby, Collinsville, Glenpool, Jenks, Owasso, Sand Springs, Sapulpa, Skiatook, Sperry, and the unincorporated areas of Tulsa County.

Recommendations received will be considered by INCOG, CDBG Urban County Policy Committee, and the City of Broken Arrow in developing the Consolidated Annual Action Plan to be submitted to HUD. Comments or proposals, where feasible, will be incorporated into the Plan to be submitted to HUD by May 15, 2025.
