










## **Urban X-Ray Buildings**



### Flood Research

- Met with David Williams, Chief, Hydrology and Hydraulics Branch at U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Tulsa District), on 2/11/23
- New dam is going in below Creek Turnpike. It will not affect this location
- Flooding originates from Keystone Dam & is predictable 18-24 hours in advance
- Flood elevation is 595' msl (all structures on site will be built at 600' msl or above)
















Site plan with soccer fields rearranged



















































Aspen Amphitheatre Site Plan
