21 O.S. Section 280 provides the following:

- A. It is unlawful for any person, alone or in concert with others and without authorization, to willfully disturb, interfere or disrupt state business or the business of any political subdivision, which includes publicly posted meetings, or any agency operations or any employee, agent, official or representative of the state or political subdivision.
- B. It is unlawful for any person who is without authority or who is causing any disturbance, interference or disruption to willfully refuse to disperse or leave any property, building or structure owned, leased or occupied by state officials or any political subdivision or its employees, agents or representatives or used in any manner to conduct state business or any political subdivision's business or operations after proper notice by a peace officer, sergeant-at-arms, or other security personnel.
- C. Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not more than one (1) year, by a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- D. For purposes of this section, "disturb, interfere or disrupt" means any conduct that is violent, threatening, abusive, obscene, or that jeopardizes the safety of self or others.

Title:

Presentation of the PFAS Study Findings and Future Considerations for Broken Arrow's Drinking Water System

Background:

Utilities Department staff will provide a presentation to the Broken Arrow Municipal Authority regarding the findings of a comprehensive per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) study conducted by HDR Engineering. Through this presentation, Staff will show that the City of Broken Arrow drinking water currently meets and exceeds the new regulations by being roughly half of the set regulatory limits for both PFOS and PFOA.

The study evaluated available PFAS sampling and water quality data, existing treatment processes, and current and anticipated federal regulatory requirements to better understand potential impacts to the City of Broken Arrow's drinking water system.

The presentation will summarize HDR's evaluation of the City's existing treatment processes, potential PFAS treatment technologies and operational strategies, and possible infrastructure and planning needs associated with PFAS regulations. Staff will also review the study's key findings and discuss considerations for future PFAS monitoring, regulatory compliance, treatment needs, and long-term capital planning.

This item is being presented to the Authority for informational and discussion purposes. No action or approval is requested at this time. The presentation is intended to keep the Authority informed of the study findings, evolving PFAS regulations, and potential considerations for the City as it continues to provide safe, reliable, and high-quality drinking water to the community.

Title:

Presentation of Fats, Rags, Oils, and Grease (FROG) Ordinance Update
and Sewer System Protection

Background:

Utilities Department staff will provide a presentation to the Broken Arrow Municipal Authority regarding proposed updates to the City's Fats, Rags, Oils, and Grease (FROG) ordinance. Staff has reviewed the existing ordinance and identified opportunities to strengthen requirements intended to protect the City's sanitary sewer collection system, lift stations, and wastewater treatment facilities. Fats, oils, grease, rags, and other prohibited materials entering the sewer system can contribute to blockages, equipment damage, sanitary sewer overflows, increased maintenance, and additional operational costs.

The presentation will provide an overview of the proposed ordinance updates, including recommended changes to requirements for applicable businesses and facilities, inspection and maintenance provisions, monitoring, education, and enforcement. Staff will also discuss how the proposed changes are intended to reduce FROG-related impacts, improve sewer system reliability, and provide clearer expectations for customers and regulated facilities.

This item is being presented to the Authority for informational and discussion purposes. Staff will review the proposed changes, answer questions, and receive feedback from the Authority prior to bringing a final ordinance update forward for consideration at a future meeting.
