#### 6. General Authority Business

A. 16-1295 Consideration, discussion, and possible approval and authorization to purchase one 56,000 gross vehicle weight (GVW) cab and chassis from Premier Truck, pursuant to the Oklahoma statewide vehicle contract, for the Sanitation Division

Lee Zirk, General Services Director, stated that the 56,000 GVW truck in question would be used to collect bulky waste on the refuse route, specifying that purchase of the grapple loader body had just been approved under item B in the Consent Agenda. He explained

that on all contract purchases, the Purchasing Department tabulated a bid tab so that pricing of each and every truck available under the contract was plain to see. Mr. Zirk pulled up the bid tabulation on the screen for all to see. He pointed out the lowest priced truck available. Consulting with the Fleet Management Department, he learned that they did not support purchase of that truck. They recommended the next truck listed, a Freightliner International truck from Premier Truck, with the purchase price of \$789. Proceeding to the next page, Mr. Zirk highlighted their experiences in 2015 with the International trucks. Their records showed that there were a lot of warranty claims in connection with all six 2015-model trash trucks used by the City. They had experienced a lot of down time, with one truck out of commission for 121 days. Since International hadn't made any particular changes from their 2015 models, they were apprehensive that if they purchased another International truck they would be dealing with the same kind of inadequacies in performance. For those reasons, he and staff were recommending purchase of the Freightliner International truck.

Trustee Parks stated if they had a preference that could be put in the bid request he wouldn't see any problem with the purchase, but he wondered if the bad experiences they had were reason enough not to take the lowest bid. Chairman Thurmond and Mr. Zirk pointed out that six different trucks had presented problems. Chairman Thurmond asked City Attorney Beth Anne Wilkenings opinion on the matter. Ms. Wilkening stated that they could get into a situation where they automatically excluded that particular bidder from bidding on all projects, which was a drastic step. In order to do so, they would have to go through a very exhaustive process to avoid compromising due process rights. By going with the second lowest bidder under the circumstances, they had outlined to her satisfaction, all the concerns they had with those particular vehicles. The company had been given the opportunity to be considered for the bid and it was more defensible to handle the matter in that manner.

Trustee Lester commented that taking into account the down time they had experienced, the difference in price between the lowest and second lowest bids did not justify their going with the lowest bid. Trustee Eudey cited the difference to be less than \$1,000. Mr. Zirk elaborated that having to address issues covered by warranty entailed two mechanics having to take the time to go to the dealer to drop the truck off, and a return trip after the truck was serviced, also. He pointed out that sometimes the truck would have to be towed. Furthermore, when the warranty expired they would still have to live with the trucks and reoccurring problems. Trustee Eudey inquired if they had had experience with the Freightliner trucks. Mr. Zirk replied that they had, and although he could not say that they were perfect trucks, they were better than what they were currently experiencing with the International trucks. Ms. Wilkening added that the issue was distinguishable from the public competitive bidding act and their Code of Ordinances took into consideration a variety of factors, including performance or prior experience. She was confident that the proposed vehicle represented the most advantageous purchase for citizens and the Municipal Authority. City Manager Michael Spurgeon said he was in agreement based on the amount of time they were spending on maintenance, according to a conversation he had had with Lee Zirk. Trustee Parks said he just wanted to be sure because he had spent many months in Court over their practices with regard to bidding.

Consideration, discussion, and possible approval and authorization to execute Resolution Number 944; a resolution repealing and replacing Resolution Number 555 and approving and adopting a financial policy for the Broken Arrow Municipal Authority relating to maintaining Emergency Reserve Fund Balance

Finance Director Tom Caldwell recalled that in 2007/2008 the City Council approved Resolution Number 944, requiring a 180-day Emergency Reserve Fund balance, based on the first six months expenditures of the previous year. It included not only operations and maintenance but all debt service and all capital outlay. The new Resolution which they were recommending for approval, reduced the required Emergency Reserve Fund balance to 90 days. It would retain capital outlay, operations and maintenance, but eliminate debt service associated with the Oklahoma Water Resources Board (OWRB) loans which

referred to as FAP loans under the Financial Assistance Plan. Those loans had a one-year reserve balance already built into the bond issue, so that they already had the last year of payment on the bonds, plus in an emergency they could draw from that money to pay debt service. He believed that there was a policy also, that they were not recommending necessarily, for the first three months of the year. What would happen before with the six months of Emergency Reserve Fund balance, was when they had a debt service payment of over \$1 million in principal, it only hit once a year and they had to keep \$1 million in the balance because they hit in the first six months. Additionally, depending on when they spent their capital, if they purchased a number of trucks, say, in the first six months of the year, it would all count towards the calculation of the Reserve balance. In a way, the previous policy inflated the amount that was actually necessary or what they would deem necessary to meet their needs. Mr. Caldwell and his staff thought the change to 90 days was an appropriate response, which would allow them to keep the rates a bit more stable, and would fill their needs.

#### B. 16-1371

Consideration, discussion, and possible approval and authorization to execute Resolution Number 957; a resolution agreeing to file an Amended Application with the Oklahoma Water Resources Board ("OWRB") for Financial Assistance through the State Loan Program, with the loan proceeds being for the purpose of paying for costs related to design, construction, and inspection of water and sewer system improvements; designating a previously paid application fee; designating legal and financial professionals to assist in the application process; authorizing the Chairman and Secretary to execute certain application documents; and containing other provisions related thereto

Assistant City Manager of Operations Ken Schwab recalled that on September 20th BAMA approved a Resolution for an application to go before the Oklahoma Water Resources Board (OWRB) for some water and sewer projects. One of the amounts was \$20,200.000. He reported that in the interim, staff took a look at the Timber Brook lift station, which was supposed to collect wastewater from new school being constructed. The plan had been to upgrade the 209th lift station and the Timber Brook lift station accordingly, before the next school opened, there being two schools planned for the site. Staff realized that it needed to go ahead and get construction going immediately, which led them to consider amending the application amount by adding about \$1.4 million. Secondly, they needed to add some mixers in their ground storage tank at Tiger Hill, and possibly Battle Creek, to help the residual disinfectant. The total cost of that was less than \$2 million. Fortunately, OWRB waived some of the reserve requirements, so that the actual amendment to the application was for \$800,000 only, covering the two projects. Essentially, the City was still putting in almost \$2 million itself, but the OWRB had waived some of the reserve that the City had had to hold previously. In summary, were only asking for the amount to go from \$20,200,000 to \$21 million, with the rest of the application remaining as the initially.

#### **Background:**

The City of Broken Arrow is required by Oklahoma Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (OPDES) Permit No. 0040053 to operate a pretreatment program in accordance with Section 402(b)(8) of the Clean Water Act, the general pretreatment regulations (40 CFR 403) and the provisions of the approved industrial pretreatment program. In the month of October, the City of Broken Arrow is required to submit a status report to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) of the pretreatment program activities for the previous 12 months. City pretreatment staff submitted an annual report to DEQ outlining pretreatment activities for significant industrial users that discharge wastewater to the Lynn Lane wastewater treatment basin. The report is for the period of October 2015 to September 2016.

The following is a summary of the report:

The industrial user survey is continually updated in Broken Arrow. All non-residential utility accounts are required to fill out a one-page survey as a part of their application for service. The survey is then forwarded to the pretreatment office for review. No new industrial user permits were added to the Broken Arrow pretreatment program as a result of the surveys.

All influent and effluent priority pollutant scans performed in the last 12 months were below maximum allowable headworks limitations and Oklahoma limits for water quality standards. No industrial users in the Lynn Lane wastewater treatment basin were significantly non-compliant in this timeframe. Blue Bell is currently non-compliant with City of Broken Arrow pretreatment standards, but does not meet the qualifications for significant non-compliance. Un-permitted discharges from Blue Bell Creameries put strain on the treatment process at Lynn Lane Wastewater Treatment Plant. City staff drafted a consent order that will be presented to Broken Arrow Municipal Authority next month.

Broken Arrow pretreatment staff works hard to educate residents and businesses about wastewater pollution prevention. A summary of the FY 2016 pollution prevention efforts is included in the report.

Staff recommends that the Authority acknowledge submittal of the Broken Arrow/Lynn Lane FY 2016 Annual Pretreatment Report to the DEQ.

The City of Broken Arrow Industrial Pretreatment Program Annual Report for the period October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016 is hereby submitted. Please note the following overall general comments in addition to the required forms:

#### Report of Changes to the Approved Pretreatment Program

There have been no changes made or requested to the current City of Broken Arrow/Lynn Lane WWTP Approved Industrial Pretreatment Program.

#### Industrial User Wastewater Survey

The IU Wastewater Survey is continually updated in Broken Arrow. All new commercial utility customers are given a one-page short survey to fill out before they can obtain water service. The surveys are then forwarded to the pretreatment office. A comprehensive IU Survey is performed every 5 years and will be performed again in 2017. No new industrial permits were added to the City of Broken Arrow Industrial Pretreatment Program as a result of the survey during this time period. All records pertaining to the survey are kept at the pretreatment office for your review.

#### Report on Pass Through, Upset and/or Interference

Regarding Influent and Effluent priority pollutant scans, all parameters were below both maximum allowable headworks loadings (MAHL) and Oklahoma Water Quality Criteria.

The City of Broken Arrow Lynn Lane Wastewater Treatment Plant experienced difficulties in the past year due to aging equipment and sewer infrastructure. There was a long list of maintenance issues noted on the FY 2016 DEQ compliance evaluation inspection (CEI) that were attributed to a disintegrating sewer line that allowed large quantities of dirt to enter the Lynn Lane Wastewater Treatment Plant. This had a





negative impact on the mechanical integrity as well as the treatment process. In addition to the mechanical/treatment issues, the Lynn Lane Wastewater Treatment Plant experienced un-permitted slug loadings from Blue Bell Creameries that put strain on the treatment process. The City of Broken Arrow has since repaired the sewer line and mechanical issues, and is requiring Blue Bell to take action to eliminate the possibility of any future instances of this kind.

The City of Broken Arrow has been working closely with Blue Bell for the past several years to come to an agreement about installation of pretreatment equipment at the Blue Bell facility. Blue Bell was given a corrective action plan by the City of Broken Arrow during FY 2014. Blue Bell was asked to make steps to stabilize pH fluctuations and reduce excessive BOD and TSS by March 2015. These steps were supposed to be a precursor to the pretreatment structure that Blue Bell had agreed to construct during the future facility expansion that was to begin in late 2015. As you know, Blue Bell shutdown the Broken Arrow facility in April 2015 due to a listeria outbreak. This event postponed the Blue Bell facility expansion indefinitely. The City of Broken Arrow has sufficiently provided Blue Bell time to "get back on their feet" and is now in the process of issuing a consent order.

The City of Broken Arrow drafted a consent order that has gone through legal channels at Blue Bell and City of Broken Arrow and is expected to be signed by both parties next month. The consent order requires Blue Bell to hire an engineering firm, perform a wastewater discharge characterization study, construct a pretreatment facility and come into compliance with City of Broken Arrow Wastewater Discharge permit #BA 007.

Blue Bell has hired Gresham, Smith and Partners as their engineer and is in the process of performing wastewater sampling that will help them determine pretreatment solutions. I will send you a copy of the signed consent order and milestone reports with the FY 2017 Annual Pretreatment Report.

#### Report on Other Administrative Activities

During the 2015-2016 pretreatment year no Industrial Users were significantly non-compliant (SNC).

Broken Arrow Powder Coating moved all operations to "Location 2" in the Haikey Creek Wastewater Treatment Basin in February 2016. The last self-monitoring report that was submitted from Location 1 was in November 2015. The City of Broken Arrow did not inspect or sample Location 1 during this pretreatment year.

The City of Broken Arrow issued a categorical/metal-finishing wastewater discharge permit to PACCAR Winch in August. PACCAR Winch submitted a Baseline Monitoring Report, Toxic Organic Management Plan and Accidental Spill Prevention Plan with their permit application. PACCAR Winch has not yet begun discharging wastewater from this process and has not submitted a quarterly self-monitoring report.





#### Pollution Prevention

The City of Broken Arrow places a high value on pollution prevention. Please read the following list of activities for FY 2016:

- Broken Arrow MET Recycle Center yearly totals: Antifreeze recycled = 950 gal; Cooking oil recycled = 100 gal; Motor oil recycled = 10,740 gal
- Reasor's cooking oil recycle station yearly total = 296 gal
- 482 food handling establishment (FHE) inspections were performed. Inspections consist of: looking at manifests for grease interceptor maintenance, checking the grease interceptors for signs of proper maintenance and repair, and discussing best management practices (BMP). FHEs with maintenance issues are given 15 days to correct them. Re-checks are performed to ensure compliance.
- Grease-related sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) are being tracked and responded to on an individual basis. Sewer system collection crews camera the line after an SSO to determine the cause and provide reports to pretreatment staff. City pretreatment staff distribute cooking oil collection bottles and recycling guidance to residents in problem neighborhoods.
- Cooking oil collection bottles and recycling guidance were given to Adult Care/Assisted Living Facilities and is continually available to residents at City Hall.
- City pretreatment staff developed a food truck, catering and concession stand database and began surveying companies operating in Broken Arrow for details about the type of cooking done and wastewater disposal sites. These businesses are being asked to discharge wash water at a facility with a grease interceptor. Special attention is given to the maintenance records at such facilities.
- A new FHE BMP was created and is being distributed at this time. The new BMP is a sign that management is being asked to display for employees to view. I have attached a copy of the BMP.
- FHEs without grease abatement equipment are being asked to install the equipment. Seven FHEs installed equipment this year.
- City pretreatment staff hosted a bottle decorating contest for 2<sup>nd</sup> graders in Broken Arrow Public Schools. Students were given cooking oil collection bottles to decorate and take home along with recycling information. The winners were given Toys R Us gift cards.
- City pretreatment staff hosted a Kid's Corner booth at the Earth Day event at the Broken Arrow Farmer's Market. Kids spent the day coloring a book with water conservation, recycling, and fats, oil & grease pollution prevention facts.
- City pretreatment staff made a presentation at the annual Homeowner's Association Workshop about FOG Pollution Prevention and the importance of recycling used cooking oil.
- City pretreatment staff hosted another Kid's corner booth at the Broken Arrow Farmer's Market. Kids were given cooking oil collection bottles to decorate and





take home to use in their own kitchen. They were also given recycling information.

• City pretreatment staff developed an auto shop database, survey, and BMP. Inspections consist of going over best management practices and checking hazardous/waste manifests. I have attached a copy of the BMP.

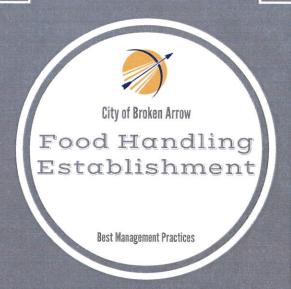
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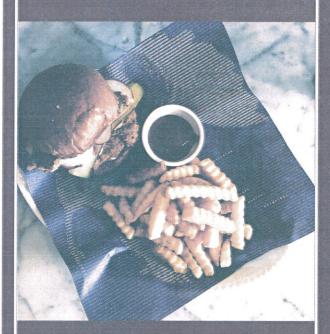

This guide has been written for food-handling establishments in Broken Arrow. It contains procedures for reducing the amount of Fat, Oil, & Grease (FOG) in wastewater discharged from food-handling restaurants, schools, cafeterias, retirement homes, bars, hospitals and other related food-handling businesses (i.e. any business requiring a food-handling license from the Tulsa or Wagoner County Health Department).

For more information call the City of Broken Arrow Pretreatment Coordinator at (918) 455-4762 Food handling establishments should perform the following practices and procedures in order to comply with City of Broken Arrow Municipal Code Sections 24-503; 511(g).

## Facility Cleaning and Maintenance

- 1. Minimize the usage of soaps and degreasers.
- 2. Recycle waste cooking oil and other grease products. Never pour these substances down any drains
- 3. Establish a schedule for collecting and cleaning grease-laden areas (e.g. fryers, vents, grills, etc.)
- 4. Dry wipe/scrape plates, trays, cooking utensils, pots and pans before washing. Scrapings are to be placed in trash receptacles.
- 5. Clean up spills immediately.
- 6. Dry sweep floors prior to washing and mopping. Place sweepings in trash receptacles.

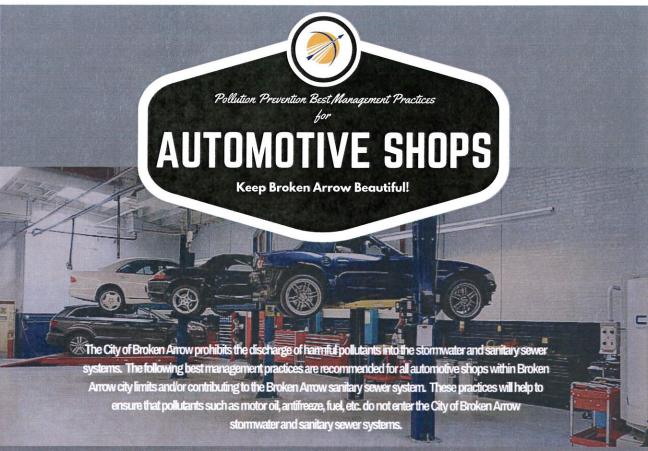
## Grease Interceptor Maintenance

Grease interceptors are to be pumped and cleaned as follows:

- 1. On a schedule that ensures proper maintance. At least Quarterly.
- 2. The clear liquid contents of the interceptor, as measured by a sludge judge, is less than or equal to 75% of the interceptor's capacity (25% grease and solids combined or greater), or
- 3. A sample collected immediately downstream of the interceptor indicates the presence of visible FOG or solid material(s), or
- 4. The analytical results of a sample taken immediately downstream of the interceptor indicates an O&G concentration of more than 100 mg/L

## Record Keeping

- 1. Maintain a log of the inspections and maintenance activities performed.
- 2. Maintain a readily available file that also contains copies of manifests received from grease haulers.
- Material Safety Data Sheets for all chemicals, soaps, cleaners and biological products used at the facility are to be maintained at the facility in an organized and accessible manner.
- 4. All records of activities required by this BMP (inspection and maintenance logs and manifests) are to be kept at the facility for a minimum of three years and shall be readily available for review by representatives of the City of Broken Arrow.



#### Operate a Clean, Dry Shop

- Sweep or vacuum the shop floor frequently.
- Designate specific areas indoors for parts deaning.
- Cleanup any spill promptly.
- Make sure rags, damp mops, absorbents, and other cleanup supplies are readily accessible to all work areas.
  Never sweep or flush wastes into a sanitary sewer or storm drain.

#### Prevent Spills and Leaks

- Drain fluids from leaking or wrecked vehicles as soon as possible. Use drip pans and plastic tarps.
- Promptly transfer drained fluids to a designated waste storage area.
- Place bulk fluids, waste fluids, and batteries in secondary containment to capture accidental spills and leaks.
- -Contact City of Broken Arrow immediately if any spills occur. For stormwater spills call (918) 259-7000. For spills entering the sanitary sewer system, call (918) 455-4762. For after hours spills, call (918) 259-8400.

#### Practice Waste Reduction and Recycling

- Recycle automotive fluids, solvents, cleaners, absorbents, and wash waters when the useful life is finished.
- Mix only the amount of paint needed for the job.
- Use self-contained sinks and tanks when deaning with solvents.
- Reuse water when flushing and testing radiators.
- Automotive fluids are NOT acceptable for disposal to the sanitary sewer, storm drain, or garbage. Manifests must be kept available for 3 years for the offsite disposal of such substances.

- Properly Manage Shop Wastewaters

   Wastewaters must be discharged through an oil/water separator before entering the sanitary sewer system. Examples include: wastewaters from controlling overspray or dust in the paint booth, degreaser washoff, wet sanding, radiator flushing, floor washdown, mop water, and other production uses.
- Maintenance records and pumping manifests for separator shall be made available for inspection for 3 years.

#### Protect Outdoor Work Storage Areas

- If work or materials storage must be done outdoors, prevent potential pollution of rain and runoff by covering and/or berming work areas.

#### Properly Manage Vehicle Washwaters

- Soapy or oily vehicle washwaters must not be discharged to the City of Broken Arrow stormwater system. These wastes may be collected for off-site disposal or filtered through an oil/water separator before discharge to the sanitary sewer
- Minimize use of deaners, degreasers, and soaps.

- Properly Manage Raw and Waste Materials Follow all hazardous materials and hazardous waste storage and disposal
- requirements.
   Hazardous waste shall not be discharged to the stormwaler or sanilary sewer
- Oil or solvent-saturated absorbent must be managed as a hazardous waste.
- Make sure solid waste containers are in good condition and secured against wind, leakage, or vandalism,
- Contact City of Broken Arrow immediately if any spills occur. For stormwater spills call (918) 259-7000 ext. 5434. For spills entering the sanitary sewer system, call (918) 455-4762. For after hours spills, call (918)

- Label and inspect Storm Drain inlets

   Label storm drain inlets on your property to alert employees and customers that no dumping of wastewaters or tainted washwater is allowed.

   Prevent accumulated pollutants from washing down storm drains on your property by inspecting drains on premises frequently.
- Sweep or vacuum work areas and parking lots regularly.
- Remove debris and dispose of it in the trash
- Spot clean areas to avoid runoff. Avoid using blowers which only displace

#### Notify and Train Employees to Practice Pollution Prevention

- Post this sign in an area seen by all employees and train employees on the use
- Train employees on the separation, storage, and recycle of wastes.

#### **Background:**

City of Broken Arrow pretreatment staff prepared a quarterly report to the Regional Metropolitan Utility Authority (RMUA) outlining pretreatment activities for significant industrial users and food handling establishments discharging wastewater to the Haikey Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant. The activities listed are for September through November 2016.

The following is a summary of the report:

All Broken Arrow significant industrial users (SIU) in the Haikey Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant basin are in compliance with City of Broken Arrow pretreatment regulations as listed in the Broken Arrow discharge permits and municipal code.

Mandatory industrial user monitoring reports were received by the due dates, and laboratory analysis were in compliance with permit requirements. Surcharges for bio-chemical oxygen demand (BOD), total suspended solids (TSS), and oil & grease above residential thresholds were issued to Unifirst for September laboratory analysis in the amount of \$4,701.65 and for October laboratory analysis in the amount of \$4,268.45.

Pretreatment staff submitted the RMUA/Haikey Creek FY 2016 annual pretreatment report to the DEQ. The report is attached for your review. Please devote special attention to the pollution prevention efforts taking place.

City staff is working on several best management practice programs aimed at giving specialized operating procedures to commercial entities that have a potential to discharge pollutants of concern into the publicly owned treatment works. Auto shop inspections are now underway. City staff is looking for hazardous/waste disposal manifests and distributing best management practice signs that auto shop management can post for employees to view. A carwash questionnaire and database were developed to track oil/water separator and sand trap maintenance schedules. City staff is offering assistance to management at the carwashes who have been experiencing illegal dumping.

City of Broken Arrow staff continues to make good progress on the Fats, Oil and Grease (FOG) program. One

hundred and twenty food handling establishment inspections were performed this quarter. Special attention was devoted to establishments that had violations during previous inspections. Grease-related sanitary sewer overflows are being tracked and areas of concern are being targeted for community awareness efforts. Cooking oil collection bottles and pollution prevention brochures are being distributed to residents and commercial property management. Residents are encouraged to recycle vegetable based cooking oil at one of the City's two locations.

Staff recommends that the Authority acknowledge the September through November 2016 Pretreatment Report to the Regional Metropolitan Utility Authority.

All Broken Arrow significant industrial users (SIU) in the Haikey Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant basin are currently in compliance with City of Broken Arrow pretreatment regulations as listed in the Broken Arrow discharge permits and municipal code.

The following is a brief synopsis of the major activities of the Broken Arrow Industrial Pretreatment Program for, September to November 2016. This update is in regards to pretreatment issues and industrial wastewater discharges pertaining to the R.M.U.A.'s Haikey Creek WWTP.

#### September 2016

#### Fats, Oil & Grease (FOG) Program:

- City of Broken Arrow pretreatment staff inspected 32 food handling establishments (FHE) in the month of September. Staff inspected manifests for grease interceptor (GI) maintenance, looked at GI, and discussed best management practices. FHEs with improperly-maintained interceptors have been asked to perform maintenance immediately. Re-checks are done for non-compliance issues.
- 2. Broken Arrow developed a new FHE best management practice (BMP). The new document is a laminated sign that FHEs are asked to display in an area where employees can view it.
- 3. Broken Arrow utilities staff met with Forest Hills adult care facility management (again) about the GI maintenance schedule. The manhole directly downstream from this facility has experienced multiple grease-related sanitary sewer overflows and they have been asked several times to increase their GI pumping schedule. This time, city staff met with administration instead of just maintenance staff. Forest Hills administration has agreed to increase the pumping schedule to quarterly on the large GI (previously done semi-annually) and monthly on the small GI (previously done quarterly). Forest Hills administration was cooperative and ready to do what it takes to keep excessive grease from accumulating in the sewer lines. Broken Arrow will be monitoring their progress.

#### Industrial Pretreatment Activities:

- 1. City of Broken Arrow wastewater discharge permits require the permit holder to perform scheduled (either semi-annual, quarterly or monthly) self-monitoring for specific contaminants and report the analytical results to the City by the 15th of the following month. The following reports/certifications were received and reviewed in the month of September:
  - CSI Aerospace compliance monitoring report and laboratory analysis. No deficiencies were noted.
  - Unifirst compliance monitoring report and laboratory analysis. No deficiencies were noted.
    - \*Surcharges for bio-chemical oxygen demand (BOD), total suspended solids (TSS), and oil & grease above residential thresholds were issued to Unifirst as a result of September laboratory analysis in the amount of \$4,701.65.
- 2. Auto shop inspections are now taking place in Broken Arrow. Staff is distributing BMP signs to auto shop managers and asking that they display them in a place where their employees can easily view. Staff is looking at manifests for hazardous/waste disposal and entering the information into the database.

#### October 2016

#### Fats, Oil & Grease (FOG) Program:

- 1. Broken Arrow pretreatment staff inspected 58 food handling establishments (FHE) in the month of October. Staff focused on FHEs listed, at their last inspection, as having: full interceptors; dirty oil recycle-station areas; no maintenance manifests on-site and insufficient GI maintenance schedules.
- 2. Broken Arrow pretreatment staff are working to inform Broken Arrow residents about pollution prevention practices that can be put in place at their homes to decrease chances of sewer back-ups and help keep fats, oil & grease out of the City sewer system. Staff continues to distribute cooking oil collection bottles and recycling information to residents in neighborhoods that have grease-related sanitary sewer overflows. These materials are also available at the Broken Arrow One Stop Center.

#### Industrial Pretreatment Activities:

- City of Broken Arrow wastewater discharge permits require the permit holder to perform scheduled (either semi-annual, quarterly or monthly) self-monitoring for specific contaminants and report the analytical results to the City by the 15th of the following month. The following reports/certifications were received and reviewed in the month of October:
  - Unifirst compliance monitoring report and laboratory analysis.
  - \*Surcharges for Bio-chemical Oxygen Demand (BOD), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), and Oil & Grease above residential thresholds were issued to Unifirst as a result of October laboratory analysis in the amount of \$4,268.45.
- Upon invitation by Mr. Hudson, pretreatment staff went to RL Hudson Co. for an industrial user survey update. RL Hudson Co. does not need a wastewater discharge permit, per 40 CFR 403. All hazardous/waste materials are being hauled offsite and manifests are being kept.
- 3. The FY 2016 annual pretreatment report for Haikey Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant was submitted to DEQ. The report is attached for your review. The report consists of:
  - Comparing quarterly priority pollutant laboratory analyses to Oklahoma water quality standards and maximum allowable headworks loadings (MAHL) based upon influent daily flow.

- Calculating significant non-compliance for 12 months for industrial users (IU) based upon technical review criteria, violations, etc. This requires a complete file review for each permitted IU.
- 3) Summarizing IU self-monitoring and reporting for the 12-month period of October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016.
- 4) Summarizing IU inspections and City-performed monitoring for the year.
- 5) Summarizing pollution prevention activities for the year.
- 6) Summarizing IU survey activities for the year.
- 4. Broken Arrow staff developed a "Car Wash Questionnaire" to determine maintenance practices and procedures for oil/water separators and sand traps.

#### November 2016:

#### Fats, Oil & Grease (FOG) Program:

- 1. City pretreatment staff inspected 30 food handling establishments (FHEs) from November 1 to November 27, 2016. Staff focused on FHEs listed, at their last inspection, as having: full interceptors; dirty oil recycle-station areas; no maintenance manifests on-site and insufficient GI maintenance schedules.
- 2. The Utilities Department sent out a community alert to all Broken Arrow residents, via the emergency callout system, asking them to recycle used cooking oil this holiday season.

#### Industrial Pretreatment Activities:

- 1. City of Broken Arrow wastewater discharge permits require the permit holder to perform scheduled (either semi-annual, quarterly or monthly) self-monitoring for specific contaminants and report the analytical results to the City by the 15th of the following month. The following reports/certifications were received and reviewed in the month of November:
  - Unifirst compliance monitoring report and laboratory analysis. No deficiencies were noted.
  - Broken Arrow Powder Coating compliance monitoring report and laboratory analysis. No deficiencies were noted.

The RMUA/Haikey Creek WWTP Industrial Pretreatment Program Annual Report for the period October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016 is hereby submitted. Please note the following general comments in addition to the required forms:

#### Report of Changes to the Approved Pretreatment Program

There have been no changes made or requested to the RMUA/Haikey Creek WWTP Approved Industrial Pretreatment Program.

#### Industrial User Wastewater Survey

The IU Wastewater Survey is continually updated in Broken Arrow. All new commercial/industrial utility customers are given a one-page short survey to fill out before they can obtain water service. The surveys are then forwarded to the pretreatment office. A comprehensive IU Survey is performed every 5 years and will be performed again in 2017. No new industrial permits were added to the City of Broken Arrow Industrial Pretreatment Program as a result of the survey during this time period. All records pertaining to the survey are kept at the pretreatment office for your review.

#### Report on Pass Through, Upset and/or Interference

There have been no instances of pass through, upset or interference resulting in OPDES permit violations known or suspected to have been caused by industrial users at any of the POTW covered under the RMUA/Haikey Creek WWTP Industrial Pretreatment Program.

#### Report on Other Administrative Activities

During the 2015-2016 pretreatment year no industrial users were published as significantly non-compliant (SNC).

#### Pollution Prevention

Both City of Broken Arrow and City of Tulsa place a high value on pollution prevention. Please read the following list of activities for FY 2016:

- Broken Arrow MET Recycle Center yearly totals: Antifreeze recycled = 950 gal; Cooking oil recycled = 100 gal; Motor oil recycled = 10,740 gal
- Tulsa MET Recycle Centers combined yearly totals: Antifreeze recycled = 275 gal; Cooking oil recycled = 600 gal; Motor oil recycled = 6,052 gal





- Reasor's Broken Arrow cooking oil recycle station yearly total = 296 gal
- 482 food handling establishment (FHE) inspections were performed in Broken Arrow.
   Inspections consist of: looking at manifests for grease interceptor maintenance, checking
   the grease interceptors for signs of proper maintenance and repair, and discussing best
   management practices (BMP). FHEs with maintenance issues are given 15 days to
   correct them. Re-checks are performed to ensure compliance.
- Tulsa FOG BMP program staff performed surveys, office visits, and investigations.
   Tulsa's Partners for a Clean Environment, PACE, program provides website recognition, pledges and decals for display to FHEs who participate and are in good-standing with Tulsa BMP requirements.
- Tulsa FOG Workshop for FHE Employees was held.
- Grease-related sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) are being tracked and responded to on an
  individual basis in Broken Arrow. Sewer system collection crews camera the line after
  an SSO to determine the cause and provide reports to pretreatment staff. City
  pretreatment staff distribute cooking oil collection bottles and recycling guidance to
  residents in problem neighborhoods.
- Cooking oil collection bottles and recycling guidance were given to Broken Arrow Adult Care/Assisted Living Facilities and is continually available to residents at Broken Arrow City Hall.
- Broken Arrow pretreatment staff developed a food truck, catering and concession stand database and began surveying companies operating in Broken Arrow for details about the type of cooking done and wastewater disposal sites. These businesses are being asked to discharge wash water at a facility with a grease interceptor. Special attention is given to the maintenance records at such facilities.
- Tulsa Pretreatment staff require all mobile food vendors to have a wastewater disposal plan approved in order to receive their business license. The vendors are inspected yearly.
- A new FHE BMP was created and is being distributed in Broken Arrow at this time. The new BMP is a sign that management is being asked to display for employees to view.
- In Broken Arrow, FHEs without grease abatement equipment are being asked to install the equipment. Seven FHEs installed equipment this year.
- Broken Arrow pretreatment staff hosted a bottle decorating contest for 2<sup>nd</sup> graders in Broken Arrow Public Schools. Students were given cooking oil collection bottles to decorate and take home along with recycling information. The winners were given Toys R Us gift cards.
- Broken Arrow pretreatment staff hosted two Kid's Corner booths at the Broken Arrow Farmer's Market. The first was an Earth Day event. Kids spent the day coloring a book with water conservation, recycling, and fats, oil & grease pollution prevention facts. At the second Kid's corner booth, kids were given cooking oil collection bottles to decorate and take home to use in their own kitchen. They were also given recycling information.
- Tulsa pretreatment staff attended Earth Day events, Home and Garden Show, Sustainable Tulsa meeting, OSU Lifelong learning group and had displays at Reasor's Grocery Store locations.
- Broken Arrow pretreatment staff made a presentation at the annual Homeowner's Association Workshop about FOG Pollution Prevention and the importance of recycling used cooking oil.
- Broken Arrow pretreatment staff developed an auto shop database, survey, and BMP.
   Inspections consist of going over best management practices and checking hazardous/waste manifests.





• Tulsa pretreatment staff operate a pharmaceutical/medical disposal program, a dental mercury amalgam program, a silver BMP program and a radiator BMP program.

#### **Background:**

In an effort to provide the Authority and the Public more information with respect to our community's water usage, the Utilities Department Staff has prepared a Total Water Supply Report that records total daily water usage, as well as monthly water volume delivered to the community.

Over the course of the first ten (10) months of the year, the Maximum Water Plant Production Day was 20.5 million gallons per day (MGD) recorded on June 22, 2016. The Average Day usage through the end of October is 12.6 MGD. Total water treated at the plant up to the end of October is 3,716.9 million gallons (MG). Total water purchased from Tulsa is 95.0 MG.

The new 61<sup>st</sup> Tulsa connection was turned on August 4, 2016, and this additional supply supplements the 41<sup>st</sup> Street connection. Water Treatment Plant staff turn on/off both Tulsa connections to meet system demand.

This report will be updated on a monthly basis. Staff recommends the Authority acknowledge submittal of the Report.

Presentation and update on Long-Range Water Supply Plan

### **Background:**

More than ten (10) years ago, as our water purchase contract with the Oklahoma Ordnance Works Authority (OOWA) neared expiration, the City Council along with the Authority recognized the need to develop a long-term plan of action and a strategy to ensure our community obtained an adequate and sufficient water supply for our customers. On February 16, 2004, the City Council established a Long Range Water Supply Committee and tasked it with the responsibility to study the community's then current-day water supply system, develop and analyze water supply alternatives, and make recommendations to the water supply system in order to provide adequate and sufficient water for our community for a 50-year planning horizon. On March 6, 2006, the City Council adopted the Committee's recommendations.

As a direct result of the Committee's efforts and the Council's action, the City began evaluation and analysis of the Verdigris River water source and followed with the subsequent design and construction of a new 20 million gallons a day (MGD) micro-filtration membrane water treatment facility and system improvements including a supplemental water connection with the Tulsa Metropolitan Utility Authority (TMUA). Recently, the City constructed a second supplemental water connection with TMUA improving the community's overall water supply capabilities to approximately 28 plus MGD and providing a secondary source in case of unforeseen situations.

In May 2016, the Authority entered into an agreement with HDR, Inc., the professional consulting firm engaged for the community's water supply improvements, to incorporate our existing water supply line network that once served as our treated water supply line from OOWA to the city but was rendered inactive once the new plant came on-line in April of 2014 into our Water Master Plan. On November 28, 2016, HDR met with Staff and presented five (5) detailed alternatives including capital costs as well as operational costs associated with each alternative.

The OOWA water supply line truly serves as a potential conduit not only to the City of Broken Arrow, but also to the Tulsa metropolitan area. This water supply line coupled with our water treatment plant and facilities may provide the community with several interesting and potential rewarding opportunities.

Staff intends to distribute the final draft report due by the end of the year to the Authority members and then schedule a subsequent work study session in the part of 2017 once the Authority has had an opportunity to examine the report.
