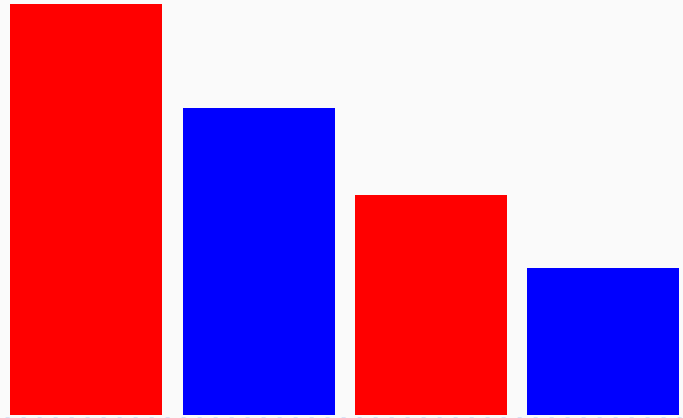
Voter P.R.E.P Program

The Voter P.R.E.P Program will act as a 10-month program with three tiers:

- The Youth Advisory Board - Youth voice & creativity
- State partnership and assistance from the Oklahoma State Election Board
- Public Educational Events with the public and financial support from the city of Broken Arrow

The Facts:

With demographic data provided by multiple sources, including OK Election Results, it is predicted that we will determine a low percentage of registered and/or active voters that are ages 18-25 in our upcoming elections.



The Facts:

Oklahoma is 5th in the nation for lowest voter turnout rates in 2020.

The youngest voters (ages 18 - 25) have had the lowest turnout rate in every presidential election since the legal voting age was lowered to 18.

Less than 1/10th of our citizens voted in the local 2019 election (10,776 total votes for Wards 3, 4, and the At Large seat).

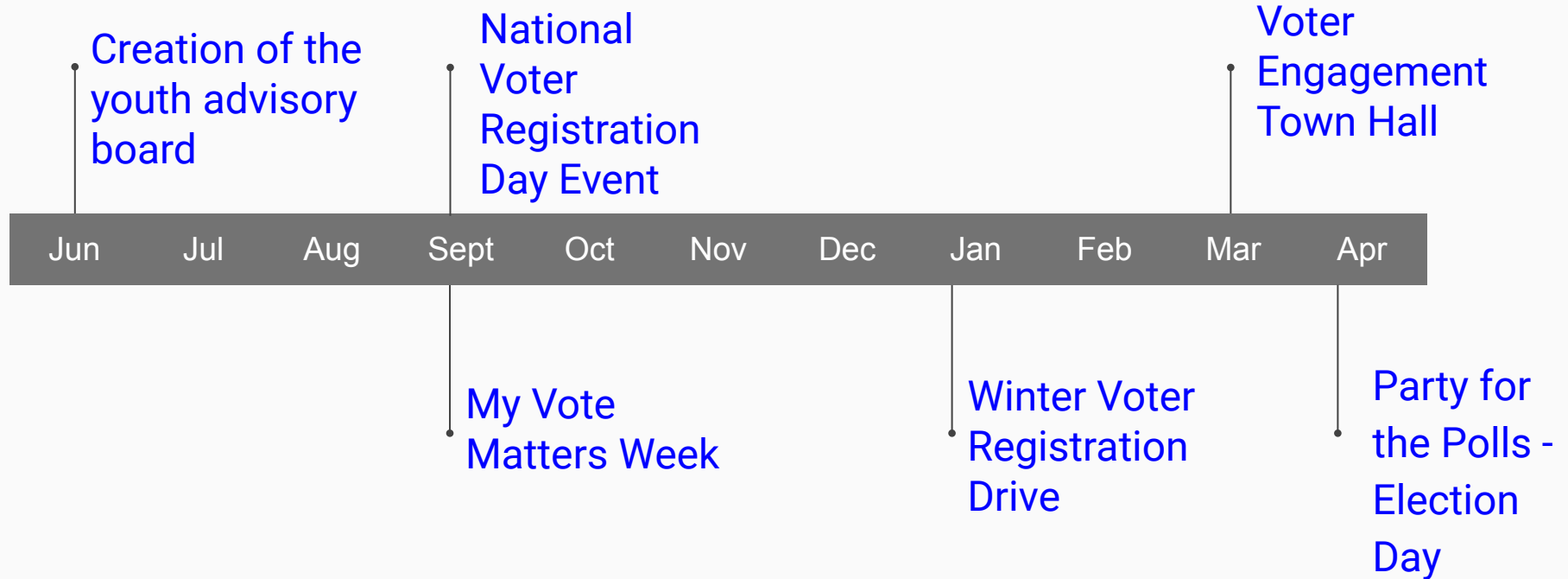

How it works – Voter P.R.E.P Program

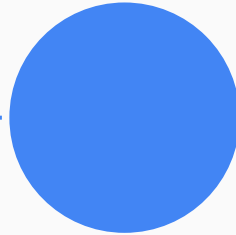
Step 1

Create the internal youth advisory board to spearhead the project.



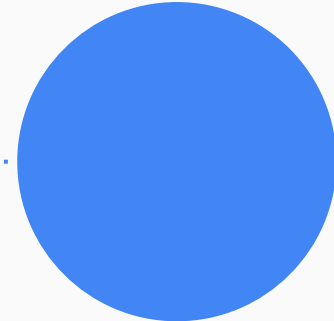
Step 2

Step 3

Plan, coordinate, and host the projected public events with the public and financial support from the city.



Hopeful Outcomes

It appears that less than 1/6th of our population is acting on the choices a vote can make for our community. Our goal is to increase voter turnout figures for the April 6th, 2021 election (Wards 1 and 2) by at least 10% and the increase will be measured by OK Election Results, an entity within the Oklahoma State Election Board.
