Presentation by the Broken Arrow Youth City Council on the 2020 Congressional City Conference, and recognition of Youth City Council Seniors and presentation of certificates

Background:

The purpose of Broken Arrow Youth City Council (YCC) is to introduce its members to municipal government and increase their civic engagement. At the end of each school year, we like to share some highlights and recognize the outgoing seniors for their service.

The YCC met regularly during the school year under the direction of City Council Members Johnnie Parks and Scott Eudey, along with staff members from the City Manager's and Parks departments.

During the monthly meetings, the YCC had the opportunity to hear presentations from various departments including: Police, IT, Economic Development and Tourism, Parks & Recreation, and Community Development. They also had the opportunity to tour the History Museum and downtown Broken Arrow, as well as job shadow various staff members in areas of interest to them.

Three seniors members were chosen to attend the National League of Cities (NLC) Summit in San Antonio in November, and ten senior members traveled to Washington, D.C. in March to attend the Annual NLC Congressional City Conference. While in Washington, they participated in conference programs, visited national monuments, experienced public transportation, and took part in activities with other Youth Councils from across the country. YCC members raised funds to help pay for their own travel expenses.
